This letter is from W.J Carver, Lieutenant, U.S.N, Boston, Navy Yard to an unidentified sea captain

July 26, 1917

Dear Captain;

Your name has been given us by Mr H.H White who, you will remember, wrote you under date of November 17,1916, and again on February 5, 1917, asking your co-operation in regard to the reporting by telephone or telegraph activities of enemy aliens along the coast of Maine, especially with reference to the establishment of submarine bases and wireless plants, etc.

This office has been requested by the Navy department, Washington, to ask you to please continue this excellent service and report each and every occurrence of a suspicious nature to the District Communication Superintendent, Navy Yard, Boston, mass. Telephone, Charlestown 1400, extension 200- or the Naval Section Headquarters nearest to you. The Section Headquarters are located at Portland, Portsmouth, Nachias, Bath, Bar Harbor, and Rockland, Maine.
